What is an HPV Champion?

A Vaccine, Vaccination or Immunization Champion is a physician, nurse or other healthcare professional who:

- ✓ Promotes immunization activities
- ✓ Delivers or coordinates immunization education
- ✓ Ensures appropriate immunization documentation is completed
- ✓ Communicates pertinent information about immunizations
- ✓ Evaluates immunization workflow
- ✓ Demonstrates leadership, collaboration and advocacy
